<b>Robotics Team:</b> The grant funded building supplies and expenses associated with competitions, including registration fees and travel related expenses (appx. 80 students).	\$8,000.00
<b>Music Technology Equipment:</b> The grant provided updated technology for the classroom, including laptop, camcorder, audio interface, saxophone, cables, music binders, and OMEA membership fees (allowing students to audition for OMEA events) (benefiting appx. 432 students)	\$3,705.14
<b>Men of Power College Tour:</b> The grant supported a weeklong trip to Tuskegee University, Morehouse College, Spelman College, Clark Atlanta, North Carolina A&T, Hampton University, Howard University, Tuskegee Airmen Museum, Civil Rights Museum, 16 <sup>th</sup> Street Baptist Church, the White House, the United States Capital, Coca Cola Headquarters, and the Jamestown Settlement (appx. 50 students – 87% of which are on free/reduced cost lunch program)	\$8,921.00

<p><b>AATF Memberships for BTW French Teachers:</b> Membership is necessary in order for students to enter the National French Contest (appx. 50 students)</p>	\$110.00
<p><b>Site Tech Administrators Stipend</b></p>	\$2,060.00
<p><b>American Association of Teachers of Spanish &amp; Portuguese Membership:</b> Membership is necessary in order for students to participate in the National Spanish Exam. (approx. 12 students)</p>	\$65.00
<p><b>German Exchange Trip:</b> Ongoing (25 year old) exchange program with Max-Planck Gymnasium in Boblingen Germany. Students experience German language and cultural immersion. Visits include: Dachau Concentration Camp, Berlin Wall and Stasi Museums. (approx. 8 students)</p>	\$5,000.00
<p><b>Japanese Sister City Exchange:</b> A delegation of 10 students experience Japanese language and cultural immersion through a home-stay with high school students and their families in Utsunomiya, Japan. BTW hosted 20 students from two sister schools last year.</p>	\$4,859.21
<p><b>Lonestar Showcase Music Festival:</b> Thirty choir students perform and are evaluated during Festival. The choir also visits SMU's music department to learn about music studies at a college level.</p>	\$4,480.00
<p><b>Anti Plagiarism Software License Renewal:</b> The anti plagiarism and composition software allows students and teachers to review work for authorial integrity and supports all students through BTW's core curriculum.</p>	\$7,125.50
<p><b>Climate Health Improvement Program:</b> Equipment for 2 teachers.</p>	\$200.00
<p><b>Air Force JROTC Trip:</b> Forty three cadets and four chaperones attend the Airfare South Central Regional Drill Championships where cadets learn about cyber security, flying operations, fight equipment and aerospace science.</p>	\$13,955.00

<p><b>Instrument Maintenance and Renewables:</b> Purchase of a percussion instrument for Jazz Ensemble, batteries for tuners, and diagram chart. Replace old strings on instruments and provide brass and woodwind maintenance. (84 students)</p>	\$2,164.85
<p><b>World Youth Ambassador Program:</b> Awarded and funded by the Department of State, two students and a teacher travel to Chile and Argentina. BTW Foundation's grant covers pay for a substitute teacher (\$1,380) and educational materials for the classroom purchased while in Latin America (\$500).</p>	\$1,850.00
<p><b>Student Artwork Exhibition Materials:</b> To display students' work and build awareness of BTW visual arts curriculum.</p>	\$1,359.28
<p><b>National Academic Team:</b> Eight students and two teachers compete in the National Academic Championship Varsity and Junior Varsity division in New Orleans, LA. The BTW OSSAA 2015-16 6A students were state champions.</p>	\$8,269.91
<p><b>AP Latin Summer Institute:</b> The grant covers the travel related expenses for Ms. Carr-Lonian to participate in the AP Latin Summer Institute.</p>	\$1,555.00
<p><b>Engineering Classroom Supplies:</b> The grant provides tools and consumable supplies to enable students to practice fabrication skills and workbooks for a course based on OAS Engineering Standards academic objectives (benefiting appx. 40 students).</p>	\$1,341.00
<p><b>Speech &amp; Debate Coach Stipend</b> (benefitting appx. 130 students)</p>	\$900.00
